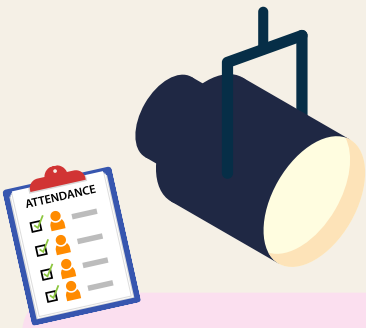

ATTENDANCE SPOTLIGHT



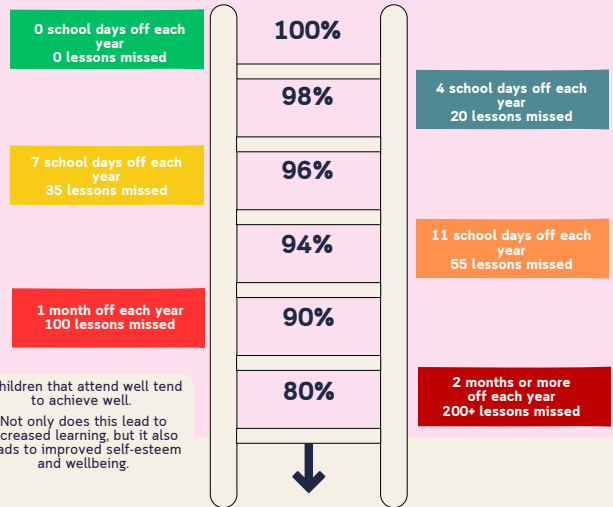
Absence from School
