- Gardening Club - for the fantastic work they are doing de-weeding the Key Stage 1 flower beds!

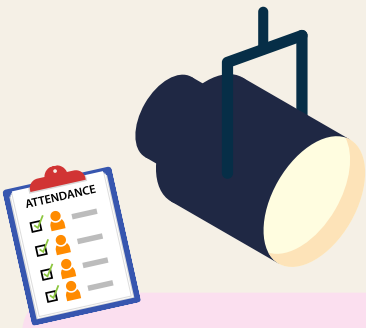

ATTENDANCE SPOTLIGHT



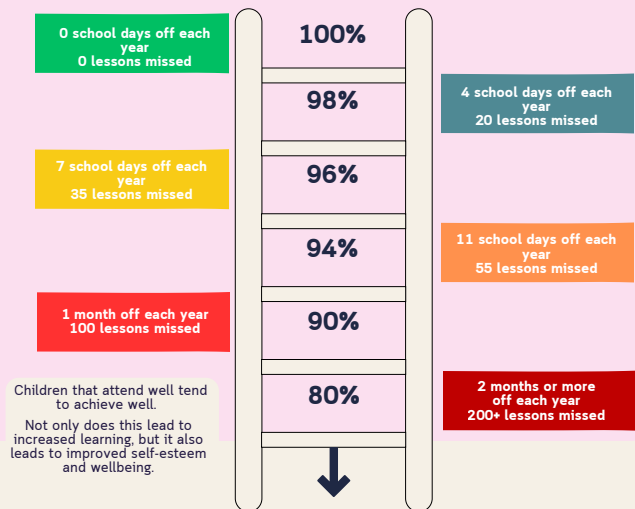
Absence from School

CHARACTER SPOTLIGHT



Our character curriculum this week has focused on developing ambition across the school, encouraging children to aim high, challenge themselves and take pride in their learning. In Year 4, pupils have demonstrated this through their growing confidence in using ambitious, subject-specific vocabulary when answering questions, particularly in science and geography lessons. This has helped deepen understanding and improve the quality of discussion across the curriculum. In KS1, teachers have placed a strong emphasis on developing communication skills, with children consistently encouraged to answer questions in full sentences. As a result, pupils are becoming more confident speakers who can clearly explain their ideas, extend their responses and engage positively in classroom discussions.
