

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

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Year 2 have been working towards achieving their Character passport challenge of 'folding their clothes neatly' before and after our nativity dress rehearsals. They have really enjoyed their English work based on the advert of the 'Greatest Gift' and have written their own narratives for the beginning, middle and end. They have been learning about the sides and vertices of 2D and 3D shapes. The Year 2 children took part in an online science workshop where they learnt about 'chromatography'. They had great fun watching the colours spread and appear as the water was added. Well done this fortnight Year 2!



### **RECEPTION**

What a couple of weeks Reception have had! Pupils have been preparing and practising for our Christmas Jingle with such enthusiasm and excitement. In maths, Reception have been working hard on one more and counting up to 20. In phonics and literacy they have been focusing on their story of the week 'Stickman', including sounding and blending words to create some wonderful sentences! Reception have made us so proud with how kind and thoughtful they have been towards their new visiting Elf and have been trying so hard to be ready, respectful and safe in the classroom.

Year 1 have risen to the Character passport challenge by reminding each other of tidying up and keeping everyone safe. In math they have amazed us with their adding skills and Ms Bisset has enjoyed hearing them use the correct mathematical vocabulary when writing number sentences. They have even been solving word problems! In English, pupils have been observing, recalling and retelling the Christmas story and have enjoyed linking this to the story of our nativity. ### YEAR 3

This week Year 3 have been working incredibly hard on their narrative writing. They have been predicting their own ending to their class story 'This Morning I Met a Whale' and they have blown Ms Piper-Thompson away with their enthusiasm and resilience.
