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## CLASS UPDATES

### RECEPTION

What an exciting two weeks Reception have had back at school! They have a brand new theme this term and have been learning all about animals. They have been fact writing in their literacy lessons, using their phonic skills to sound out full sentences! They have been painting, collaging, cutting and making creations of different animals. In maths they have been continuing with their learning of using smaller numbers to make big numbers and this week have been looking at length and height - even measuring themselves against their friends!

### YEAR 1

Year 1 have had a great start to the new term and are full of enthusiasm about their learning. They have continued with addition and subtraction using numbers up to 20. They have learnt some great songs to help them remember their number bonds and doubles. In English, Year 1 have written non-fiction pages all about Yate. They enjoyed learning facts about different landmarks in Yate and writing them down to share with others. Now they are starting a new writing unit that began with a message from a wolf! Can you guess the fairy tale the class are reading?

### YEAR 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic start to Term 4. All the children have come back ready for new learning! In maths, the children have been learning about measuring length and height. They have been introduced to centimetres and meters, and have been enjoying measuring lots of things around the classroom and comparing their lengths. Year 2's English has been linked to history this term and they have been introduced to the Tudors. The children have been learning about Henry VIII and the names of his six wives. In Science, the children have been learning about their basic needs and that they need air, water, food and shelter to be able to survive.



### YEAR 3

Year 3 has had the best start to the new term. They have started their new topic 'The Iron Giant' and have been looking at forces and materials in science. In English they have started the text of 'The Iron Giant' and have even made their own Iron giants. They look amazing. They have really enjoyed all of the science experiments and designing that has been going on so far! Keep up the good work Year 3!



### YEAR 4

Year 4 have had a great start to the term. They have enjoyed learning about their new topic 'Battlefields', focusing on identifying events and the background of The Battle of Hastings. In maths they have been showing their great understanding of multiplication and division with formal and informal methods. In P.E, Year 4 have started exploring their new unit - Outdoor Adventurous Activities, where pupils have had to find out where the printed photos were taken around school and use the values in the picture to go to the place they think it is. This has helped them develop their communication and collaboration skills.



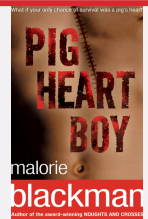
### YEAR 5

In English, pupils have been busy writing a biography about Marcus Rashford or Taylor Swift!

Year 6 has had a great start to the term. They should be so proud of the resilience they are showing and all of the hard work they are putting into every lesson. The class have started their new unit where the focus text for reading and English lessons is 'Pig Heart Boy'. This has sparked some fantastic debates about the use of animal testing and xenotransplantation. The balanced arguments that they will be writing next week will be fantastic!
