


Friday 9th June 2023

CLASS UPDATES



What a fantastic first week for Year 2! They have been incredibly kind and welcoming during our first week together. We have continued learning about "Isambard Kingdom Brunel" and the children are very excited about our upcoming trip to SS Great Britain. In Maths, the children were eager to demonstrate their knowledge of bonds to 10, 20 and 100 and partitioning 2digit numbers into tens and ones. They are looking forward to our science topic "Let's Grow" where we will be investigating plant growth.









RECEPTION

Reception have come back for their first week with giant smiles and brains ready to learn! Our theme for this term will be all things summer! This week they have looked at how plants grow and change and have started writing their own stories related to their story 'Wild Summer'. In maths they are solidifying all their previous knowledge, focusing on making numbers to 5 without manipulatives but also making numbers to 10 using manipulatives. What a great first week hack!

YEAR 1

The children have had a fantastic start to their final term in Year 1. They have enjoyed reading our new text 'The Way Back Home' and answer questions about what happened first, next and after that. In Maths they have been looking at fractions of shapes and amounts, using their skills from multiplication and division to share into equal groups. The highlight of the week was the trip to Westonbirt Arboretum. The children built on their learning in science about plants as producers and were great Tyndale role models as they walked around the park.


YEAR 3

In science, Year 3 spent some of their afternoon on the field practising a dramatic rendition of the process of seed dispersal for science. It was great. They have started their unit of shape in maths and have been showing great recall from their unit of shape from year 2! In English they have been looking at writing effective instructions and after an incredibly funny jam sandwich making lesson, they have realised the importance of using specific language in instruction making.





Year 4 have had a fantastic week of learning and have immersed themselves back into it! They have been working really hard towards their times table test and have made me very proud! They have continued learning about their Topic - The Romans which they're very engaged with and can't wait to learn more about. They have started to learn about shapes and turns in Maths, recognising the compass directions and the four different turns. Well done Year 4, keep up the amazing learning!



YEAR 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic first week! They have worked very hard learning about the features that need to be included in explanation texts in English, and have learnt how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000 in maths. They have also shown great

sportsmanship in PE cheering each other on during team games in rounders. Well done Year 5!



YEAR 6

Year 6 have got stuck into their production practice this week! They have been proactive in learning their lines and learning the lyrics to the songs for 'The Island That Rocks'. They've also shown great resilience and collaboration by learning a group dance to one of the songs. This is a fantastic start to the term, well done















TYNDALE TIMES




