

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
What do child car seats do?

They protect your precious cargo from injury in a collision, ensure the child is comfortable and is secure in the vehicle. That's why it's important the seat is correctly fitted and the child is also correctly fitted in the seat. Unfortunately a large percentage of child restraints are fitted incorrectly.

- An unrestrained child could be killed in an impact at speeds as low as 5mph.
- A properly restrained child is 3 times less likely to sustain a head injury in a collision.
- In a collision at 30mph an unrestrained child would hit the front seat, and anyone in it, with a force between 30 and 60 times their own body weight.

Children must use a child car seat until they're 12 years old or 135 centimetres tall, whichever comes first. Children over 12 or more than 135cm tall must wear a seat belt.

You can choose a child car seat based on your child's height or weight.






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Rearward-facing baby seats*


Group 0: for babies up to 10 kgs (22 lbs) roughly from birth to 6-9 months, or Group 0+: for babies up to 13kg (29lb) roughly from birth to

 Rearward-facing baby seats MUST NOT be used in a passenger seat with an active frontal airbag - its illegal.

Forward-facing child seat

Group 1: for children weighing 9-18 kgs (20 - 40 lbs) roughly from 9 months - 4 years.

Booster seats*



Only move your child to a booster seat once they have exceeded the maximum weight of the child seat or the top of their head is higher than the top of the seat

Booster cushions

Group 3: for children weighing 22 - 36 kgs (48-79lbs) roughly 6 - 11 years.

Seat belt legislation -The facts

The regulations governing the wearing of seatbelts in cars, vans and goods vehicles have applied since 2006.

The changes relate specifically to children and how they are secured in your vehicle. A message to all my Deputies.....
