We have recently contacted Monkhouse (our uniform supplier) to think creatively about how we can work in partnership with them to ensure that it is as easy as possible for you to buy uniform.



Firstly, we will no longer expect any parents to buy a coloured PE t-shirt as all pupils can now wear a plain white t-shirt and these are far cheaper to buy from a supermarket. These have been removed from the website. The only Monkhouse uniform you will need to buy is the jumper, tie and kilt (optional). All other items can be sourced on a budget from a supermarket.

We are also looking into buying uniform in bulk to store at school so that you can easily purchase items via parent pay through us. This will avoid long waiting times and paying delivery fees unnecessarily, particularly if you only need one item such as a tie.

RECEPTION

What a fantastic two weeks Reception have had. They have been working once again on their story writing linked to our Literacy story 'Emergency!' This term is all focused on People who help us and Reception have really been enjoying various jobs that they didn't realise help them everyday. In maths we are working hard on our number bonds to 10, using blocks and numicon to learn these off by heart. Let's keep it up Reception!

YEAR 1

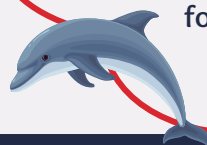

ATTENDANCE LADDER



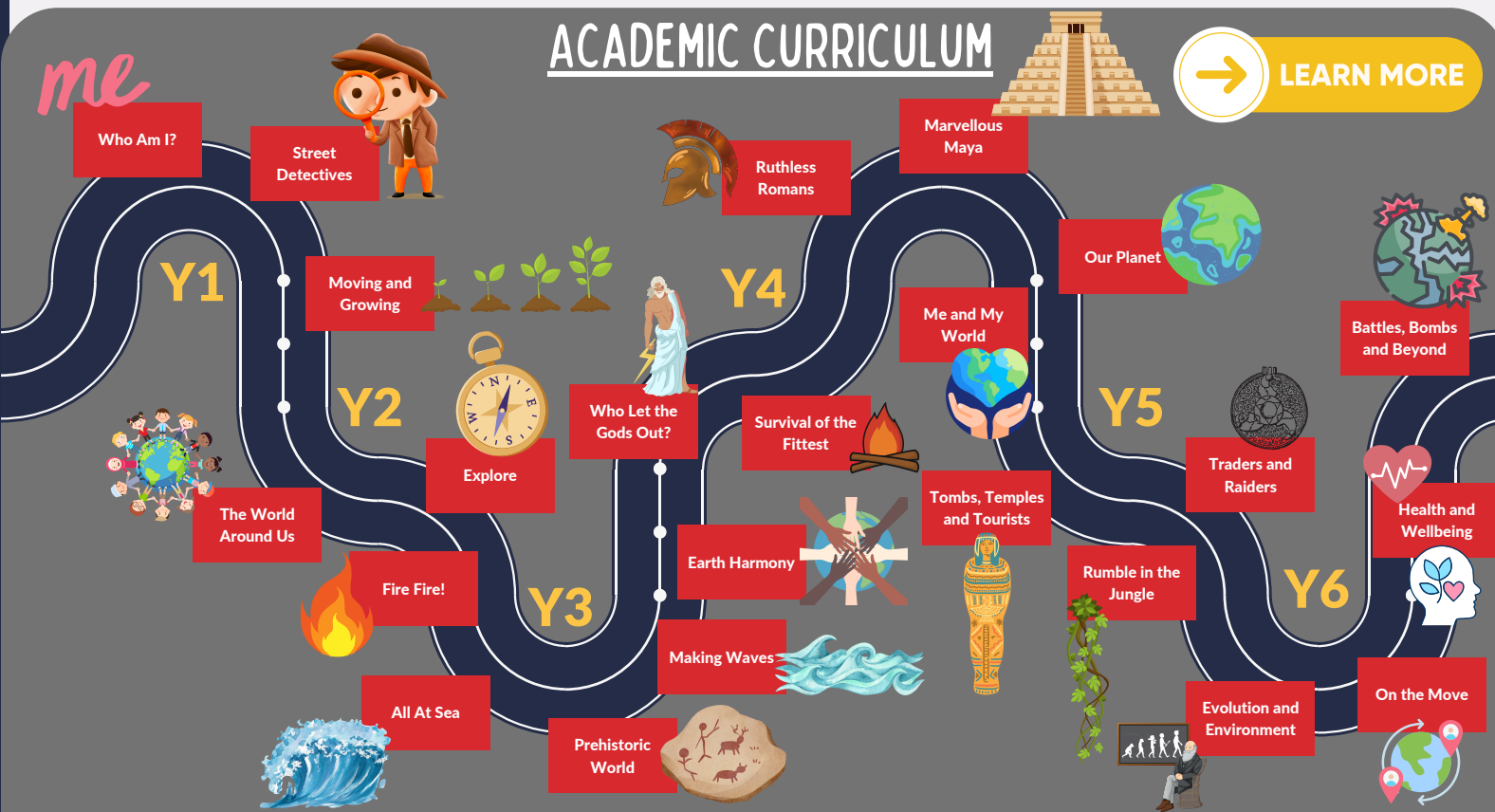
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SPOTLIGHT ON SEND



Our sensory provision has a positive impact on our children's wellbeing and learning. Children love our two sensory rooms in KS1 and KS2 as part of our SEND provision. Along with our sensory rooms, we have Calm Corners in every classroom and teaching space to support all children to thrive as part of the Tyndale Family.

We recognise the importance of inclusion and ensuring that all children with SEND have appropriate support that allows them equal access to an inclusive and balanced curriculum to reach their potential.

Year Six - Battles, Bombs and Beyond



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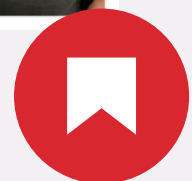
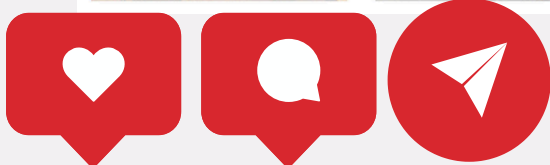
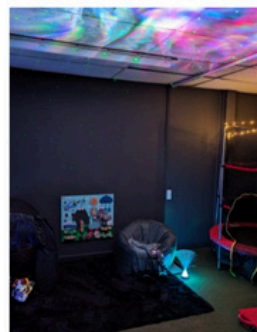
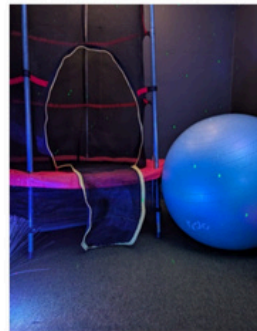
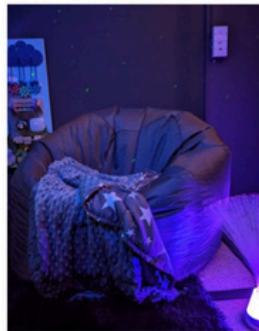
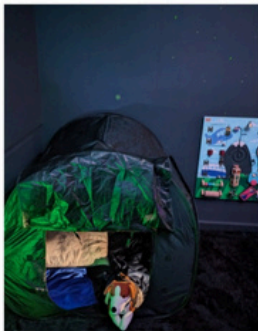
